As our team is about to start the Project activities in Kharda Randheer Panchayat of Jodhpur District, Rajasthan, We would like to take this opportunity to express our gratitude for your engagement and support to Hand in Hand India's Village Upliftment Programme. This report will reflect more about the activities that we are going to be implement along with the targets that have been set.

#### **Our Plan for Kharda Randheer**

With the onset of Village Upliftment Programme, Kharda Randheer Panchayat of Jodhpur District, Rajasthan will step into the process of transformation. Hundred Small enterprises will be created, empowering several local women. We will provide the community with access to Skill training on On-farm and Off-farm activities. We will ensure that these members will turn into Women Entrepreneurs and begin their Enterprises as per their Skill Training. We will also strengthen the existing entrepreneurs to ensure sustainability through advance business training.

Drop out and Children engaged in Child labour will be identified with the help of School Teachers, Anagawadi and Stakeholders and they would be brought to the main stream of Education.

### **Objective**

To foster Entrepreneurship in the communities for Sustainable Income Generation and Livelihoods that brings about integrated development in Kharda Randheer Panchayat, Rajasthan.

#### Methodology

The Design methodology that we propose for building a self-reliant community consists of;

- Assessment of the investment factors of the village
- Formulate the Growth strategies for the Village

## **Some of Our Future Entrepreneurs!**

Case story 1: In Kharda Randheer Village, A Self Help Group (SHG) has been formed by HiH India in the month of August 2021 under the name 'Shree Yade Maa' with ten women members. During initial consultation with the SHG group members it was found that all are engaged as Daily Wage Labour whereas four members from the group are engaged in an additional work of Papad making (Papad: A Deep fried dough made out of Black Gram flour either fried or cooked with dry heat until turned crunchy).

These four women get their orders from the Vendor for nearby city area and each of them earn around INR 2000 per month of making Papad. During the consultation meeting with the SHG members, other women also expressed their interest in Papad making. They requested HiH India to provide support with Skill training in Papad Making and Marker linkages. As the income earned by the families of the SHG Members are



insufficient to meet their day to day household expenses and Education expenses of their Children through this Papad making Enterprise they will be able to make additional income to support their families.

Hand in Hand India has assured this SHG member to support them in order to improve their livelihood through the Enterprise creation.

Organisation will provide training to them on various business techniques and will support them to scale-up this Papad Making work to a larger level as a Group Business Model. HiH India will provide them with hand-holding support in terms of Access to Credit, Training on various Business Techniques and Digital & Financial literacy, and Technical training on Papad Making and linkage with Government schemes in the next 30 months of VUP journey.





Case story 2: Ms. Pramila, 39 year-old woman lives with her husband and four children in Kharda Randheer village. Her husband works as Daily Wage Labourer and she runs a Small Fancy Shop. Both Husband and Wife earn around INR 5000-6000 per month which is insufficient to meet their day to day household expenses and they were unable to afford quality education for their children as well.

Two years back when the family was undergoing worse financial condition, she started this small fancy shop in her own house. She purchased only Laces (An Essential part of Rajasthani dressing) and started her business with it. Gradually she started selling some garments and fancy items as well

With a zeal motivation, Pramila wants to scale up her fancy shop into a larger level as her own business model to improve her family financial status.

Hand in Hand India just initiated VUP intervention in this village and she attended our pre SHG Meeting with the expectation to improve her livelihood through the enterprise creation and training on various business techniques. HIH India will provide her hand-holding support in terms of access to credit, training on various business techniques and digital & financial literacy, technical training on improving her fancy shop and linkage with Government schemes in 30 months of VUP journey.
